Reception: Autumn Term Early Years Map

During this term we will be focussing mostly on the Prime Areas of Learning (Communication and Language, Physical Development and Social and Emotional Development). Research shows that the prime areas of learning are very important as they lay the foundations for children's success in all other areas of learning. We review our planning daily in order to meet children's needs and interests.

Communication and Language:

Children will be listening to stories and ideas responding with relevant comments. Children will be extending their vocabulary and begin to confidently communicate their feelings and needs. Questions why things happen and gives explanations. Asks e.g. 'who', 'what', 'when', 'how.'

Physical Development:

Children will be developing their gross and fine motor skills in preparation for holding a pencil. They will be negotiating space and experimenting with different ways of moving. Children will be encouraged to share their independence with regards to self-help. For example, fastening their coat, putting on an apron.

Social and Emotional Development:

Children will be exploring new activities and making new friends. They will begin to accept the needs of others, taking turns and sharing resources. Children will be aware of own feelings and know that some actions and words can hurt others' feelings. We have a whole school scheme that supports children's emotional well-being.

<u>Mathematics</u>

Children will be counting and recognising numbers to ten and beyond. We will also begin to explore shape and space.

<u>Literacy:</u>

Children will begin to hear and recognise initial sounds in words. They will also recall events from familiar stories. Children will learn to write their own name.

Expressive Art and Design:

Children will explore a range of materials and textures. They will begin to build a repertoire of songs and dances.

Understanding the World:

Children will recognise and discuss the changes in the environment. Children will be able to identify some of the things that make them unique. They will also be encouraged to ask questions about aspects of their familiar world.

Additional Year Group Information:
